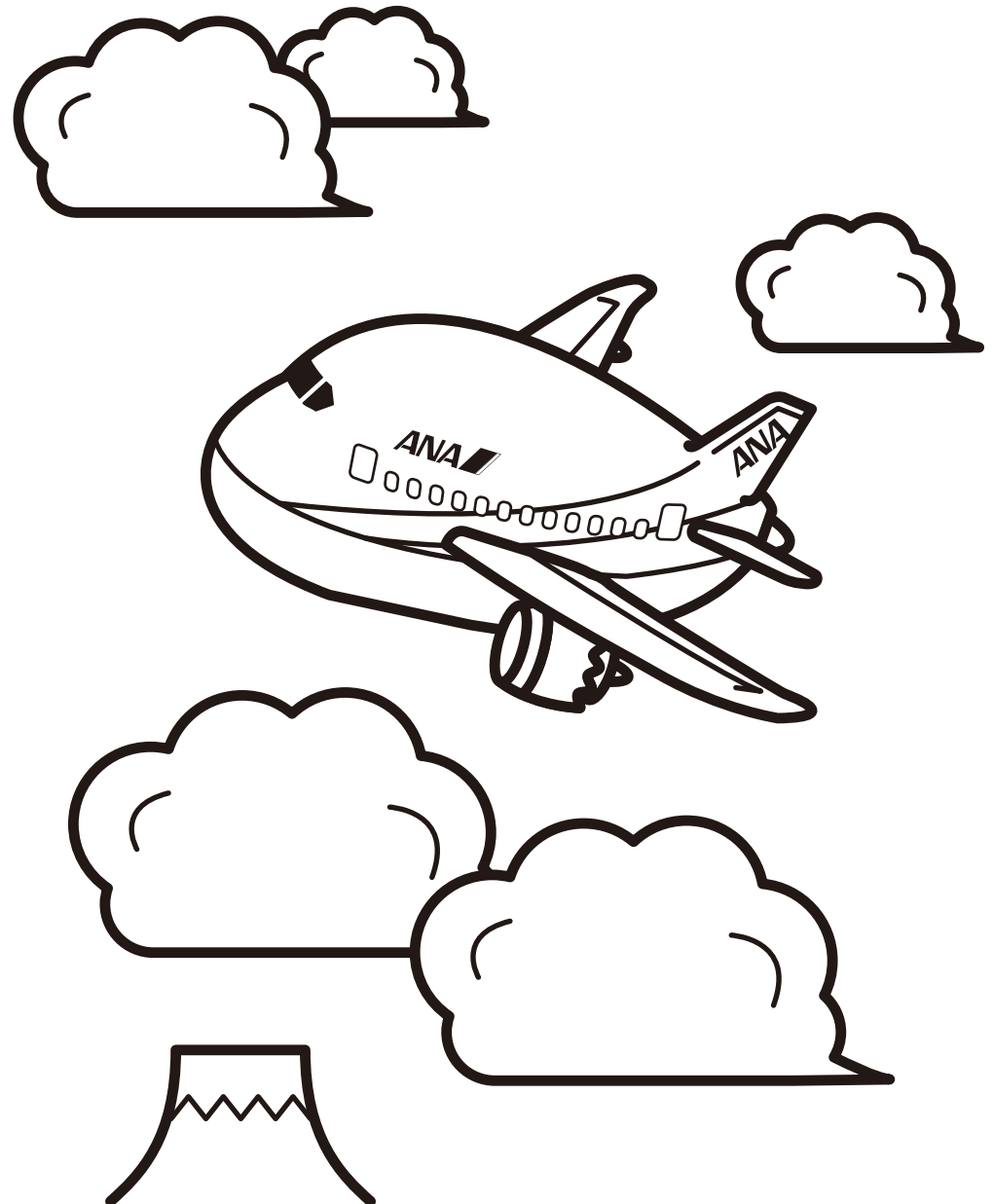

What's Different about Getting on an International Flight (a Flight to Another Country?)

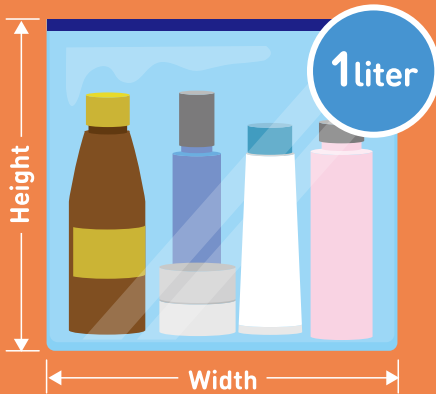

There are some more things to do for the security check.

For safety reasons, there are rules about taking liquids on the airplane. Prepare your liquids according to the rules, and show them to staff separately to the rest of your bags.



Guide for bag size

Total of height
and width must
be 40 cm or less

1 Put liquids in bottles of 100ml or less. (Things like drinks, toothpaste, shampoo, make-up)

2 Put these bottles into a see-through plastic bag of 1 liter or less with a zipper.

3 Only one bag per person is allowed on board.



2 Check in



Check in once you get to the airport.
Get in line and wait for your turn.

When it's your turn...

- Give the staff your ticket and tell them your name and where you're going.
- Talk with your family and decide where to sit.
- Give big bags to staff to put on the airplane.



Security Check



3 Security Check

Everyone who gets on an airplane takes a security check. It's a check to make sure nobody has dangerous items. Thanks to this, everyone can get on the airplane with no worries! Get in line to take the check and wait for your turn.

- While you wait...**
- Take things out of your pockets and put them in your bag.
 - Take flasks and plastic bottles out of your bag.

13 Pick up your bags

If you handed over some of your bags before leaving, make sure you pick them up.



When your turn comes, give the staff your bag and ticket. The staff will check your ticket and give it back. Once you get it back, you can take the security check.

4 Take the check



Passengers wait for a sign from the staff and go through the gate-shaped machine one by one. If you have anything metal on you, the machine will beep.



12 Get off the airplane



Get all your bags. Did you forget anything? Wait in line to get off the airplane. Make sure you say goodbye to the cabin attendants!



11 Fasten your seat belt



Fasten your seat belt when the airplane is about to land. Even after the airplane lands, keep your seat belt fastened and wait until the airplane stops.



If the machine beeps, staff will check you using a scanner. If any part of your body hurts to touch, tell the staff. Staff will open flasks and plastic bottles and check what's inside.



5 Boarding gate

Before boarding starts,
make sure you go to the toilet and
finish any shopping.

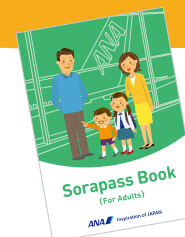


10 Spend time in your seat

9 Order a drink



When the airplane has taken off, the cabin attendants will come to hand out drinks. Order a drink from the menu!



6 Go through the boarding gate

Tap the bar code your ticket against the lit-up bit of the machine and go through the boarding gate. If the machine can't read your ticket properly, it will make a loud noise, but don't worry!

7 Ask where your seat is



A cabin attendant* will be waiting at the airplane entrance. After greeting them, show your ticket and ask where your seat is.

* Cabin attendant: A person who keeps the airplane safe and provides services on board.



8 Sit down in your seat

When you get to your seat, put your bags away. Fasten your seat belt when you're sitting down. If you don't know how to do this, ask a family member or cabin attendant.
